**In honour of our former colleague Petra Heidrich**  
(13 Nov. 1940-31 Jan. 2006)

Petra Heidrich was born 1940 in Berlin. She studied Indology and Social Anthropology at Humboldt Universität zu Berlin. In 1965 Petra Heidrich joined the Institute of Oriental Studies, Academy of Sciences of the GDR. During the 1970s she spent several years in India with her family. In 1983 she obtained her Ph.D. from the Academy of Sciences of the GDR and was a staff member of the Institute of History. In 1992 she joined the ZMO in Berlin and continued her research on social history of modern and contemporary India. Her publications include contributions on rural development programmes, on peasant movement and its role in the struggle for national independence, on agricultural labour, on social and religious reform movements and on caste activities in colonial and independent India. Finally she worked on a comparative biography of the two peasant leaders Swami Sahajanand Saraswati and N.G. Ranga.
